Proposed AY Honor

Baby Sitting – Instructor’s Key

Objective: To provide a basic education in childcare for siblings and young babysitters in NAD.

Requirements:

1) Have or earn the CPR Honor.

-A current CPR certification is MANDATORY to satisfy this requirement.

2) Learn basic first aid for babies and how to prevent poisoning in babies and toddlers.

-The First Aid Basic Honor will only be adequate for a portion of this requirement and it must have been completed within 24 months of starting this honor or the requirements must be refreshed.

-The best way to prevent the poisoning of a toddler or crawling baby is to place any non-edible substance out of the reach (or climbing reach) of the child. In case of poisoning call 911 – not poison control. Children babysitting should always call for emergency assistance first so as not to place additional time and risk of ailment on the child.

-Using “child proof” door and drawer devices will reduce risk.

-Keeping floors and tables clean and clear of aging food and drink will reduce the risk of food poisoning.
