Objective: To return Teen Pathfinders, TLT's, and staff members to a serious effort to read the Bible. This is done through 17 honors designed to fit into a reasonable 2-3 month reading period for average readers dedicating time to comprehension.



Bible Reading 15 Requirements:

- 1) Be an active participant in an AJY or AY class.
- 2) Read your annual Bible reading requirements for the class
- 3) Name the two primary or major divisions of the Christian Bible
- 4) Name the accepted subdivisions or "traditional" divisions of the Christian Bible and list the books they contain
- 5) Name the major divisions of the Hebrew Bible
- 6) Read <u>Acts of the Apostles Galatians</u> and prepare a written statement of at least two pages meeting one of these requirements:
 - a) Choose one verse or a series of verses from each book and explain how this impacted your Christian growth in your current stage of life.
 - b) What did you learn about the Love and Grace of God, and why we worship Him in each book you have read?
- 7) Keep track of your reading on the Bible reading chart for this class
